

ABC of security

Know what your role is in keeping the campus safe

What to Report:

1. Physical or verbal abuse or threat (to you or others)
2. Theft
3. Property Damage
4. Vandalism
5. Graffiti
6. Child Pornography (Note: It is neither illegal nor against Library rules for customers to view pornography or other controversial materials. The exception is child pornography which is illegal. If someone is viewing child pornography, ask staff at any desk for assistance.)

Reporting:

1. Call 9-1-1 using a cell phone, campus phone, blue outdoor security phone, or public phone. Cell phone calls to 911 are first connected to Tucson Police. Ask for UAPD.
2. Flag down a passing officer. University Police officers might be on foot, on a bicycle, or in marked vehicles.
3. Speak to someone at any library desk or the first available employee

Cell phones work throughout the building.

Free campus courtesy phones are located at the Info Commons Help Desk on the first floor and at the security desk in the Main Library lobby (near the entrance).

Pay Phones are located on Floors 1, 3, and 4 and outside near the book return

How to Report:

1. Get to a safe place
2. Call 9-1-1 to access UAPD
3. Stay where you have arranged to meet the police in order to file your report, unless it becomes unsafe to do so.
4. Write down as soon as you can all the details you recall about the incident and the descriptions of the person(s) involved. Personnel at any UA Facility will be able to give support and provide a phone, but only you can call and file a report about an incident you witnessed. *UA personnel cannot file a report on your behalf.*

Trust your instincts! When someone or something makes you uncomfortable, report it! Call 911!
